

# Consider This...

### Recipe: Birdie Biscuits

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1/2 cup water

3 tsp unflavored gelatin

3 T corn syrup

3/4 cup flour

4 cups bird seed



#### **DIRECTIONS**

Heat water, gelatin and corn syrup together over a low heat. No need to boil. Mix flour and seed together and then slowly add to gelatin mixture. While cooling, put out parchment paper on our counter, and choose your favorite cookie cutters. Spray those cookie cutters with cooking spray.

Next, fill the cutters with the gelatin mixture, pressing in the mixture tightly. Before you remove the ornament, use a straw or toothpick to poke a hole through the ornament (for hanging). Then remove from cookie cutters and let dry for several hours.

Once dry, you can attach ribbon or string and hang for the birds! Be sure you hang it somewhere that the birds can perch while feeding.
